

# Student Senate General Meeting

## Meeting Minutes

September 1, 2004, 3:30-5:30

### In Attendance:

Meeting was opened at 3:35pm.

Chris Haslage was elected to be the student voting representative.

### A. New Business:

- a. The Constitution of the Student Body was reviewed. The changes will be voted for on September 29..
- b. Club and Organization Bylaws: The revisions were reviewed and some changes were made. Under Section III, "Lynn Stovicek" was changed to "Student Life Office". Section V was also clarified. The Program Board will post their meeting schedule soon, at which time Desiree will put the info in the club boxes. Section VI was discussed. In order to verify attendance at Senate functions, sign-up sheets will be used at all events. Under Section VII, if meetings occur online, a printout of the chat will can prove that the meeting took place.  
Vote was taken for acceptance of changes in the Club and Organization Bylaws. Changes were accepted unanimously.
- c. Cubicle Guidelines: In order to verify that hours are being kept, a sign-in sheet will be posted in a binder outside of the Senate Office. Office hours will start on Monday. Rodger was called on his decision to give the Radio Station a cubicle. He defended his actions and explained that since he is the coordinator of Student Life, and he oversees all student clubs and organizations, that he is authorized to allot any club or organization space in the corner of the building in which clubs inhabit. He further explained that his actions were ethical and it is his decision to give or take any space in Student Life. Curt then stated that, in the future, if anyone has a problem with a person or the way something was handled, to take it to that person privately, rather than in a public forum.  
Vote was taken for the acceptance of changes to the Cubicle Guidelines. Changes were accepted unanimously.
